Introduction

This survey was fielded online from August 16 – 28, 2024. The sample size is 2,678 naturalized citizens who are registered to vote, including an oversample of an additional 200 naturalized citizens who are registered to vote and residing in each of Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, Pennsylvania, and Texas.

The sample was recruited through Cint's Lucid Marketplace and Bovitz's Forthright panel, employing quota sampling to maximize representativeness. Respondent-level weights were applied in two stages: first, sampling weights were applied to account for the oversample; second, post-stratification weights were applied to account for remaining observable sample imbalances on age, gender, race, Hispanic ethnicity, education, and census region.

In this document, we report weighted results for the national sample. State-level results are unweighted.

Margin-of-error for the *national* sample is \pm 1.89 (with 0.95 confidence). Sub-group margins-of-error vary by state population but range from \pm 4.6 – 6.7 (with 0.95 confidence).

- Texas: $n = 267 \text{ (MoE } \pm 6.0\%)$
